Trace the beginnings of the rise of Nazi power in our tour to Munich and Nuremberg. This tour covers the early attempts by the Nazis to gain power in Munich and the early years from the seizure of power to the beginning of the War. The earliest days of Hitler's rise to power are associated with Bavaria. A walking tour through Munich will introduce the sites connected with the early days of the Nazi party, while a short distance from the city is Dachau, the first concentration camp to be opened after their seizure of power. Nuremberg is inextricably linked with the immense rallies during the 1930s and your pupils can stand on the tribune of the Zeppelin Field from which Hitler reviewed the party faithful.

6 DAY MUNICH & NUREMBERG ITINERARY

Day 1

Travel from school to Channel coast for crossing to Calais. Continue your journey overnight to Munich.

Day 2

Arrive Munich in the late morning and go straight to your accommodation. Lunch included on arrival and in the afternoon, a walking tour of central Munich. Overnight Munich.

Day 3

Day excursion to Berchtesgaden, Obersalzberg and the Eagles Nest. Overnight Munich.

Day 4

Morning visit to Dachau. Continue to Nuremberg for afternoon sightseeing. Overnight Nuremberg.

Day 5

(No coach during the day – driver's rest day). A morning walking tour of Nuremberg. Afternoon free for sightseeing and shopping. Evening meal included before overnight drive to Calais.

Day 6

Morning arrival back in the UK and return drive to school.

Optional visits in Munich

Koenigsplatz.

The site of the old Nazi Party headquarters and a rally site and flanked by The Führerbau, the party building at Arcisstrasse 12, built as an office building for Hitler himself, and the Hofbräuhaus beer hall – scene of several Nazi meetings and some of Hitler's speeches.



Odeonsplatz.

Another parade site, flanked by the Feldherrnhalle, the scene of a confrontation between the Bavarian State Police and an illegally organized march by the followers of Adolf Hitler.

Obersalzberg.

This is a mountainside above the village of Berchtesgaden in Bavaria, Germany. The area is mostly known for being the location of Adolf Hitler's beloved mountain residence, the Berghof, and for housing the bus depot which transports tourists to the nearby Kehlsteinhaus, also known as the Eagle's Nest.

Dachau.

A Nazi German concentration camp, and the first one opened in Germany, located on the grounds of an abandoned munitions factory near the medieval town of Dachau.



Optional visits in Nuremberg

The Reich Documentation Centre.

This museum displays the history of the Third Reich, and is located in one of the buildings in the colossal Reichsparteigelaende (Imperial Party Grounds), where the infamous Nazi rallies were held.

The Luitpoldhain.

Also part of the Reichsparteitagsgelände where a number of the Nazi architecture still remains.

Courtroom 600.

The trial of the main war criminals began in Courtroom 600 of the Nuremberg Palace of Justice which had been specially converted for this purpose.
