Optional visits



Boppard.

Boppard has a lot to offer school groups, with its attractive river promenade and pedestrianised shopping centre. The Celts, Romans and Franconians have all left their mark on the 2000 year-old town and at every turn there evidence of their presence. Take a chairlift with fantastic views of the Rhine.

St. Goar.

St. Goar, located in the Rhine Gorge, is known particularly for the legend of the Loreley, associated with the dangerous Loreley rocks. A steamer trip on the Rhine can also be taken from here. (Prices and suggested routes on application). See the Medieval ruins of the Rheinfels Castle.

Phantasialand.

Located near Cologne, Phantasialand is Germany's largest theme park with over 100 attractions to suit all ages. A great place for the group to let off steam.

Rudesheim.

Here you could visit Siegfried's Mechanical Music Museum, visit a wine museum or take the cable car to the nearby Niederwald Monument.



Cochem.

In Cochem, it is possible to take a guided tour of the spectacular Reichsburg Castle, take a chairlift ride or visit the Cochem swimming complex with a wave pool and a giant 55-metre flume.

Burg Eltz.

Burg Eltz is how we all expect a fairytale castle to look. With Tudor style buildings and cone shaped roofs, it is one of the prettiest castles in Germany. A guided tour includes the armoury, the treasure chamber and the knight's hall.

Marksburg Castle.

Said to be the best-preserved on the Rhine, Marksburg Castle is the only hill castle on the Rhine that has never been destroyed.

Koblenz.

Koblenz is situated at the confluence of the Rhine and Mosel, and is full of historic buildings, cosy lanes and narrow alleyways. A sculpture of Kaiser Wilhelm on horseback overlooks the two rivers at Deutsches Eck. Take an energetic climb (or the chairlift) to the fortress of Ehrenbreitstein, for a panoramic view of the town and the two rivers.

5 Day Rhine & Moselle Tour

Day 1

Travel from your school to the Channel coast for a crossing to Calais. The journey to the Rhine/Moselle area will take about 7 hours from Calais, depending upon the location of your selected accommodation. Evening meal on arrival at your hotel.

Day 2

A full day excursion on The Rhine with a wide selection of visits to choose from. You could take a steamer trip along the river and visit the picturesque towns of Boppard and St. Goar. See medieval Marksburg Castle or visit the music Museum in Rudesheim.

Day 3

A full day excursion in The Moselle Valley. A choice of visits which could include Cochem and it's impressive castle, Burg Eltz and Koblenz with the Deutsches Eck and Ehrenbreitstein Fortress.

Day 4

Another full day of visits which could include Germany's premier theme park, Phantasialand, or possibly Cologne with it's cathedral and Chocolate Museum.

Day 5

Depart your hotel after breakfast for your return journey to Calais, arriving back at school mid – late evening.
